Filing Dates

REGULAR FILING PERIOD: Here are the dates AT THIS TIME. If there is a special session for the census and redistricting, the Primary might be in May and all dates could change.

November 13-December 13, 2021

PRECINCT CHAIRS ONLY – First day for to file application for a place on the ballot **Tuesday, September 14, 2021**

First day to file application for a place on the primary ballot with your Party Chair **Saturday, November 13, 2021**

not later than 6 PM – Deadline to file application **Monday, December 13, 2021**

Filing Procedures

Step 1: Visit the Texas Ethics Commission website or contact them for information on the reports that are required.

Step 2: File Appointment of a Campaign Treasurer by a Candidate. (Sec. 252.001)
(FORM CTA)

Candidates for county & precinct offices file with the County Clerk. (Sec. 252.005(2)) Candidates for Statewide office file with the Texas Ethics Commission as do some district offices. (Sec. 252.005(1))

Judicial Candidates file Appointment of a Campaign Treasurer by a Judicial Candidate and Judicial Declaration of Intent Regarding Expenditure Limits (FORM JCTA)

Candidates for District Judge file with the Texas Ethics Commission. (Sec. 252.005(1)(C))

Candidates for County Court at Law No. file with the County Clerk. (Sec. 252.005(2))

Step 3: Optional - File Code of Fair Campaign Practices. (Chapter 258)
(FORM CFCP)

Candidates for county & precinct offices file with the County Clerk. (Sec. 258.003(a)) Candidates for Statewide Offices and District Judge file with Texas Ethics Commission. (Sec. 258.003(a))

Step 4: File Application for a Place on the Primary Ballot and pay a filing fee or submit a petition in lieu of filing fee to the party chair. (Sec. 141.031, 172.021, 172.025)

Step 5: Follow the Texas Ethics Commission's filing schedule to turn in Candidate/Officeholder Campaign Finance Reports. (Title 15, Chapters 251-254, 254.037, 254.061, 254.063, 254.064, 254.065, 254.093, 254.094)

Filing Fees and Petition in Lieu of Filing Fee

In order to become the Republican or Democratic Party nominee for a particular office, you must file an application for a place on the ballot with the county or state party chair, as appropriate (Section 172.022, Texas Election Code).

The application for a place on the primary ballot must be accompanied by either a filing fee or a petition in lieu of filing fee signed by a certain number of qualified voters.

See Section 162.015, Texas Election Code for more details about how primary voting or candidacy affects (or does not affect) candidacy in the general election.

Section 172.025 of the Texas Election Code states the local offices have to have 2% of the total number of votes cast in the applicable territory from the 2018 gubernatorial general election or 500 signatures, whichever is less. If the number is less than 50, the required number of signatures is the lesser of (1) 50 or (2) 20% of all votes for all gubernatorial candidates cast in the applicable territory in the 2018 general election. **This information is from the 2020 SOS information. 2022 has not been posted yet.**

During campaign season, the landscape blooms with a special kind of flower - the political sign. Unlike wildflowers that are welcome anywhere, putting campaign signs on public lands is illegal. So, before you plant that sign, learn the law and keep Texas beautiful. TxDOT only regulates campaign signs under chapter 394 of the Texas Transportation Code.

You Need to Know

- It is illegal to place any signs on or within the right of way. This includes posting signs on trees, telephone poles, traffic signs and other objects on the right of way.
- Campaign signs along Texas roads can be placed on private property with the owner's permission.
- Before placing a sign inside of incorporated city limits, check with the city for applicable ordinances.

If you've placed your sign in the right of way or it's posing a traffic hazard, we will remove it without prior notice. All costs associated with sign removal will be paid by the sign owner.

Texas Election Code: Name of Candidate on the Ballot

SUBCHAPTER B. NAME ON BALLOT

§ 52.031. FORM OF NAME ON BALLOT. (a) A candidate's name shall be printed on the ballot with the given name or initials first, followed by a nickname, if any, followed by the surname, in accordance with this section.

(b) In combination with the surname, a candidate may use one or more of the following:

- (1) a given name;
- (2) a contraction or familiar form of a given name by which the candidate is known; or
- (3) an initial of a given name.

(c) A nickname of one unhyphenated word of not more than 10 letters by which the candidate has been commonly known for at least three years preceding the election may be used in combination with a candidate's name. A nickname that constitutes a slogan or otherwise indicates a political, economic, social, or religious view or affiliation may not be used. A nickname may not be used unless the candidate executes and files with the application for a place on the ballot an affidavit indicating that the nickname complies with this subsection.

(d) A suffix such as "Sr.," "Jr.," or "2nd" may be used in combination with a candidate's name.

(e) A married woman or widow may use in combination with her surname, if the same as her husband's surname, the given name or initials of her husband with the prefix "Mrs."

§ 52.032. CANDIDATES WITH SAME OR SIMILAR SURNAMES. (a) If two or more candidates for the same office have the same or similar surnames, each of those candidates may have printed on the ballot a brief distinguishing description or title, not to exceed four words, following the candidate's name.

(b) The description or title may only refer to the candidate's place of residence or present or former profession, occupation, or position. However, the description or title may not refer to a public office.

§ 52.033. TITLES PROHIBITED. Except as otherwise provided by this subchapter, a title or designation of office, status, or position may not be used in conjunction with a candidate's

name on the ballot.

§ 52.034. NAME ON BALLOT MORE THAN ONCE. A candidate's name may not appear more than once on the ballot except as a candidate for:

- (1) two or more offices that are permitted by law to be held by the same person; or
- (2) the office of president or vice-president of the United States and another office.
